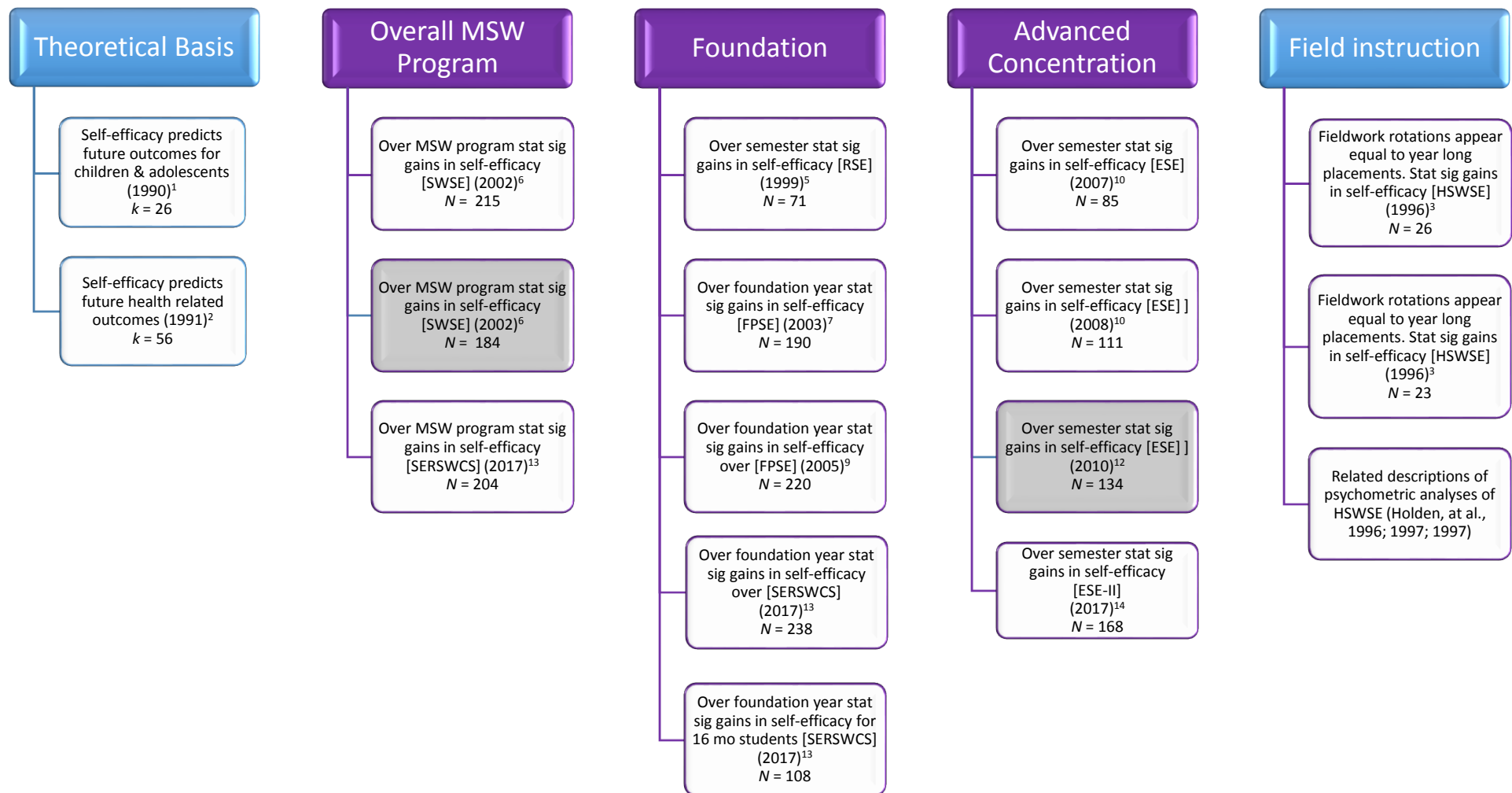


Figure 1. Self-efficacy in social work and related studies.

The left column consists of two early meta-analyses which found that ratings of self-efficacy predicted future health behavior and the future behavior of children in general.

The right column details a set of studies in which a self-efficacy scale was developed to assess the impact of an experimental field instruction rotation model.

Summary

Over 15 years and 1,900 students (purple columns), we have consistently observed statistically significant increases in students' self-efficacy across varying time intervals while attending the Silver School of Social Work.

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
