## **VII. CURRENT BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF TEACHING AND RESEARCH INTERESTS**

### **a. Research Interests**

My research is summarized as the following three sections: (1) studying the impact of migration and social welfare laws and policies on populations in transition, including both international immigrants and refugees, as well as internal migrants; (2) investigating the perception of and behavior in the community among vulnerable groups of people (such as ethnic minority and/or immigrant communities in the U.S. and internal migrant

communities in China and other developing countries); and (3) search innovative community practice models and initiatives to improve the wellbeing of vulnerable groups of people.

**b. Teaching Assignments**

I have experience teaching courses in the areas of social welfare policy, policy analysis, research, program evaluation, planning and program development, urban community organizing, immigrant and refugee issues in the U.S., and global social work. At Tulane, I am teaching Social Welfare History, Evidence-Based Practice, Community Organizing and Policy Advocacy, Capstone Seminar for Global Social Work, Contemporary Issues in Global Context, Immigrant and Refugee Issues, Theories of Social Changes and Community Practice, Global Perspective in Social Work Practice to graduate students; I am also teaching Qualitative Analysis for doctoral students, and co-teaching at Tulane Center for Aging, City Culture and Community Program and Disaster Resilience Leadership Academy programs. As part of global social work education exchange, I developed and am teaching Introduction to Social Work to undergraduate visiting international students.
